The NYCLB was established under the authority of Naval Station Instruction 1710.9 dated 23 October 1967, for the express purpose of encouraging Corinthian sailing and boating, promoting safety, traditions, customs and competition in yachting and to provide a competitive sailing identity through which members could participate in local, state and national competitive events.

As Port Services Office, Naval Station Long Beach, LCDR John Larson, originated and brought into being a sailing facility, a new form of recreation for the sailors of Long Beach. In the fall of 1967 LCDR Larson called a group of sailing enthusiasts to a meeting to organize the current club. The By-Laws were approved on 8 November 1967 with an interim slate of officers elected: Commodore-Rear Admiral Ralph Weymouth; Vice Commodore-LCDR John Larson; and Rear Commodore-Captain Charles Gardner.

More to follow in the months to come. I'd really like to include some pictures from the past showing the facility and members in action. If anyone has some that they would like to share please let me know. I can scan and print them as necessary so as not to destroy your valued possessions.

Here are some of the activities that took place this month. We had our Sweetheart Social. The food and music were excellent. The February heavy rains did not slow down the sailboat racing in the Long Beach Harbor.


In the SLBYC Saturday Sailor Series, Heinz Butner, on Raptor, is in first place in PHRF B, Chris Mewes, on Shadowfax, is in fifth place (looks like Shadowfax needs to step up their game). In PHRF C, Ben Smith, on Renegade, is in second place and in PHRF D, Paul Turang, on Dawn Patrol, is in second place.

In the SCYA Mid-Winter Regatta, Ben Smith, on Renegade, finished in fourth place.

The Tuesday sailing adventures continue to excite the senior salty sailors. Following are the results from the last four races:

- 1/31 race, six boats, on course 46, 5.2 miles, wind in the 5.0 to 9.0 range, in first place Lulu followed by Dos Amigos, Macs, Swell Lover, Callisto II and Windhaven.
- 2/7 rained out.
- 2/14 race, four boats, on course 47, 6.0 miles, wind in the 6.0 to 10.0 range, in first place Rosinante followed by Macs, Raptor and Callisto II.
- 2/21 race, five boats, on course #9, 6.3 miles, wind in the 6.0 to 11.0 range, in first place Raptor followed by Shadowfax, with Windhaven and Callisto II tied for third and Macs in fifth.


